Over the past three years, NCDMV has undergone numerous reforms as part of the “Driving Change” initiative. The overall goal of “Driving Change” has been to improve citizen access to efficient and courteous NCDMV services. As part of this effort, the General Assembly and Governor McCrory enacted legislation this past legislative session that waives the Identification Card fee for citizens with developmental disabilities.

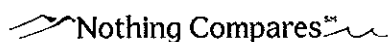
An applicant (or legal guardian) seeking a no-cost ID must complete the enclosed DL-232 “Application for Identification Card” and have their primary care provider either complete the form’s “Physician Section” or sign a letter certifying that the applicant has a developmental disability. All applicants must provide proof of age, identity, and residency by presenting documents listed on the reverse side of the DL-232. This application form is also available on the NCDMV website and at drivers license offices throughout the state.

REQUIREMENTS

To obtain a special identification (ID) card, you will need to provide two forms of identification from the list of acceptable documents listed in Table 1 (provided on the back of this form). If you are unable to provide two forms of identification from the approved list of acceptable documents, DMV will review documents that you have in your possession.

1. Provide proof of age and identity (see Table 1).
2. Provide a valid Social Security Number (SSN).
3. Provide proof of NC residency (see Table 2).
4. If you do not have a SSN, you must provide proof of legal presence in the U.S.

I understand that being diagnosed with a developmental disability permits the applicant to obtain a special identification card **FREE OF CHARGE**. In order to obtain a free identification card, the applicant or the applicant's guardian must:

- Have the applicant's primary care provider complete the "Physician's Section" below.

Table 1 (Proof of Age and Identity): You must provide proof of your age and identity from the list of documents below. Additional documents may be required if DMV is unable to verify your identity. If you do not have any of the documents below, DMV will review the documents in your possession. Note: *The Division of Motor Vehicles may copy the documents presented or hold the documents for a brief period of time to verify authenticity.*

(1) Driver License or State-Issued Identification Card from NC or another State, Puerto Rico, a U.S. Territory, or a Canadian Province	A driver license, learner's permit or ID card that is expired less than 2 years. The DL/ID or learner permit submitted must reflect a photo.
(2) Certified birth certificate issued by a government agency in the U.S., Puerto Rico, a U.S. territory, or Canada or U.S. Report of Consular Birth Abroad	Certified true copy, no photocopies unless certified by issuing agency.
(3) Original Social Security Card	When submitted as a form of identification, the original social security card is required.
(4) Valid unexpired U.S. military ID, including DD-2, DD-214, or U.S. Military Dependents Card, U.S. Veteran Universal Access Card	Other than a DD 214, documents submitted as a form of identification must be valid and unexpired.
(5) Valid, unexpired Passport from any nation	When submitted as a form of identification, the passport must be valid and unexpired.
(6) NC school transcript/registration signed by a school official, or diploma or GED from an NC school, community college or NC university	Driver Education Certificates, Driving Eligibility Certificates and report cards are not accepted as proof of identification.

Table 2 (Proof of Residency in North Carolina): All first time customers must show proof of their North Carolina residency. This is in addition to showing proof of identity. One of the two forms of your identity documents from Table 1 may be used if it reflects your North Carolina residence address. Other documents that may be used to demonstrate proof of residency are listed in the below table. If you are unable to provide a sufficient residency documents, you may complete a residency affidavit at a DMV office.
